Rick was brutally kicked out in 1994 due to differences of opinion on the band's lyrics. They were questioning lines that, in their opinion, encouraged jealousy and possessiveness as signs of love—something they were worried contributed to rape culture. The sixth BSB had suggested a few changes, like "I will never break your heart pis jvâ faire mon travail émotionnel" and "I Wish I Could Give The World To You mais on m'a dit qu'y était pas à moé". Let's just say it didn't go over well...

At their therapist's suggestion, Rick tried to get back in touch with their old boyband so they could tie up some loose ends.
