AFN ECOLOGY GROUP-KCC COLLABORATION AGREEMENT SUMMARY

- 1. The AFN Ecology Group (AFN-EG) and KCC joined forces in November 2022 to launch a carbon assessment project on KCC/MODL-protected lands aimed at assessing the carbon absorption capacity of local wetlands in support of climate change mitigation.
- 2. The AFN-EG and KCC now intend to extend this relationship to encompass long-term, ongoing collaboration between the two organizations centred on the sharing of i) conservation knowledge through active collaboration in the stewardship of KCC and AFN lands; and ii) general cultural learning through joint activities, documentation and educational sessions.
- 3. The goal of the proposed stewardship collaboration is to share conservation knowledge and practices with a view to maximizing the quality of protection and care given to the lands stewarded by the parties.
- 4. In pursuing this goal, the AFN's "Two-Eyed-Seeing" approach will be employed, that is "from one eye with the strengths of Indigenous ways of knowing and from the other eye with the strengths of Western ways of knowing, and using both of these eyes together" (– Albert Marshall)
- 5. Joint stewarding activity will initially be centred on the Carbon Assessment Project ground truthing process on the KCC Shaubac lands, involving both AFN Earth Keepers and KCC stewarding resources. Beyond this, the AFN's Earth Keepers and KCC Stewarding resources will duplicate the activity on AFNstewarded lands.
- 6. As carbon absorption is measured and documented, the joint stewardship team will be vigilant in documenting species at risk, endangered plants, etc. on the respective lands.
- When the project and joint stewardship activity are sufficiently advanced, this agreement can be taken to the AFN's council for approval so that joint funding and other collaborative activities between the two organizations will become possible.

- In-house mapping software expertise: Board member James Stephens. Interactive maps of KCC properties on our website are envisaged for the coming quarter!
- Contracted an Ontario bookkeeping and accounting firm (Accountimize Inc.) to carry out our bookkeeping activity (except bill payments) and year-end reporting.
- A new website platform, Yapla, that Veronika is mastering. This has allowed us to automate many of the aspects of the member tracking and communications process, as well as receipt and acknowledgement of funds and membership renewals.
- A recently contracted, local website manager, Lisa -- who is available to make changes to the website rapidly when we need them. Lisa has learned Yapla so is able to assist Veronika and has the expertise to manage our social media posts along with Sarah.
- A recently contracted Project Administrator, Jenny, for the management of the project budget, monitoring of deliverables and timelines, file management etc.

We expect to soon have:

• Dedicated meeting space for the duration of the project for community consultation, activities and discussions. This will also be a game-changer for the collective functioning of the Board and project personnel in the new, highly pro-active and interactive context of the Wetlands Project
