Voting Procedure During Meetings:

1. Under normal circumstances, voting during any meetings shall occur by a simple show of hands or voices if during teleconference meeting. If an issue that requires a vote is of a particularly sensitive nature, the President of the association may order that a secret ballot occur. This decision shall be at the discretion of the President.
2. Members not in attendance at a Special Meeting or Annual General Meeting of the association may vote by appointing (in writing at least 3 business days in advance of the meeting) another member as a proxyholder. The proxyholder will attend and vote at the meeting to the extent authorized by the proxy, subject to the following conditions:
 - a) A proxy is valid only at the meeting for which it is given or at a continuation of that meeting after an adjournment.
 - b) A member may revoke a proxy in writing with the chairperson of the meeting:
 - I. On the day of the meeting or the day of the continuation of that meeting after an adjournment of that meeting, or
 - II. With the secretary of the AKA no later than the last business day preceding the day of the meeting, or
 - III. The day of the continuation of that meeting after an adjournment of that meeting, at which the proxy is to be used.
3. A proxyholder has the same rights as the member by whom they were appointed, including the right to speak at a meeting of members in respect to any agenda item, to vote by way of ballot at the meeting, to demand a ballot at the meeting, and to vote at the meeting by way of show of hands.
